Join us for the launch of five new books from **Goldrock Press**: three new language books, a devotional journal, and a book on counseling Indigenous Peoples. This event presented with support from the **Manitoba Arts Council**.

Nikiwan (I Go Home) by **Pauline Apetagon** introduces children age 5-7 to basic Cree words associated with their home. These include words such as mother, father, pets, bed, plate, and spoon.

Tânisi êspitaman ininimowin ᑕᓄᓴ ᐅᓴᓴᑕᑕᑦ ᐃᓄᓄᑦᑕᐃᑦ (*How You Pronounce Cree*) by **Ann-Margaret Day-Osborne** introduces children age 3-5 to the Cree alphabet written in Cree (Roman orthography), Cree Syllabics, and English.

Biboon (It is Winter) by **Susan Johnston** introduces children age 5-7 to basic Ojibwa phrases about winter including the weather, winter sports and activities, and other delights of the season.

The Chieftain's Song by **Gary Quequish**, from Weagamow Lake of the North Caribou First Nation, is an exposition of the historical relations between Indigenous peoples and Christianity, and a discussion of the much-needed paradigm shift in counseling that asserts contextualization and respect for Indigenous peoples.

Supporting, mentoring and teaching women in crisis has been the focus of **Shona Stewart's** ministry, and her book *Serenity* is a devotional journal which encompasses a lifetime of learning, teaching and healing. A survivor helping survivors.
